

So here we are, two clubs combined into one. The beginning of a new Triumph car club. A car club that I hope lasts a very long time, like maybe forever...

Since about half of the members of our new Triumph club don't know me, I thought I would briefly introduce myself and provide a little of my club background since I was an original member of TRSC and, for those, after reading this article might wonder who is this guy that writes like he is making it up as he goes along? I'm often considered the founder of TRSC (Triumph Register of Southern California), which seems a bit of an overstatement. Historically speaking, I got the ball rolling by communicating with the National TR 2/3 Club—Triumph Register of America (TRA) in 1976 and initiated the advertising for the first meeting for TR 2/3 enthusiasts in the "Pit Stops" section of the Los Angeles Times advertising a meeting in Covina, on February 27,1977. I think everyone at that first meeting was shocked at the positive turnout! I was subsequently elected the first president, probably by default, and the one person I had recently established a TR3 friendship with prior to posting the Pit Stops ad, was elected as the V.P at that first meeting. As I'm sure it was with SCTOA (Southern California Triumph Owners Association) a multitude of people helped get TRSC off the ground and moving in the right direction and sustained it with great leadership and activities throughout the years. One major change in TRSC was after much debate, voting to include all types of Triumphs into the club in 1985 and not limiting membership to just owners of TR 2/3s. 40 years after that first meeting in 1977, we still have some original and early TRSC members with us, as we join to be one united Triumph club now known as the Triumph Club of Southern California



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(TCSC). The red 1960 TR3A I have owned since 1971 is fondly known as "Tonto," my faithful companion. I talk about Tonto, as if he is human. There is a story to that, but not for today.

As we know, not everyone likes mergers, and sometimes members may drop out of a club when it merges with another club. I encouraged the merger in discussions and voted for it, although I knew that would end TRSC, as a separate Triumph club, and a legacy of sorts. Although never a member of SCTOA, I know a few of SCTOA members, as our clubs combined our many activities over the years. However, since I don't know everyone currently in TRSC, I often didn't know who were members of which club when we were at events, and since everyone had that pleasant TR attitude, I felt comfortable, regardless which club anyone was from, some of which had dual membership. Now that we are together as one, we don't need to do double duty for events and can consolidate a number of things to keep the new club stronger, especially since we had similar goals. Long live TCSC!

For my first article for **The Standard Tribune**, I will review our recent club event to Julian. I expect it will be covered by at least one other person for this issue, but I suspect I will have some different twists to the event. This is of course, if I get this article submitted on time! Meeting newsletter submissions deadlines is a constant challenge for me.

Julian is an event that my wife Robin, Tonto and I have managed to go to three of the last four years, which is a rarity for us, especially since it is an overnighter. Once we had the date, we even made our hotel reservation before the event was on the hotel's calendar. I don't like registering late and having to try to find whatever hotel/motel still has room at the last minute. Anyone following the numerous emails for the Julian adventure is aware there was a concern regarding rain on one or both days of the trip. In my youth, I really didn't care too much about the rain. Herman restored his daughter's TR3B and his own TR-250 & TR6. As with his professional work, those vehicles were reflections of Herman's love for always doing things the best way he knew how, and never ever allowing shoddy workmanship to pass. As an avid sailor he also completed a yacht in his back yard that resulted in years of sailing with family and friends.

share with his pals but these were spark plugs! The very same thing that you needed for your Triumph TR2-TR4. By the way - it's PINK!

These are fascinating, I've been reading about their history. The CTNY is a variant of the CNY in that the seat is "T"appered. The CNY has a compression washer on it for seating, that's actually what is needed for the TR - the tapered seat would be problematic for the flat seating in the TR head. The electrode position, the color, the packaging - just plain interesting! Did you know for a time Lodge licensed their plugs to Ford? You could get a Lodge Spark plug inside a Ford branded blue box.

Oliver Lodge invented the electric spark ignition (the Lodge Igniter) for the internal combustion engine. Two of his sons developed his ideas and founded the Lodge Plug Company. Oliver Lodge is better known for his pioneering work in radio and was the first man to transmit a message by wireless. What a family.

During the war years from 1939 through 1945, Lodge's production doubled as the company provided spark plugs to virtually any sort of gasoline-powered engine, from aircraft to tanks to boats. It also produced a modified plug to be used as an igniter for flame throwers. But the majority of Lodge World War II production went to aircraft engines, which were then operating under very high heat and pressure, particularly in engines like the supercharged Rolls-Royce Merlin V-12. In order to make its plugs work in such a high-pressure environment, the company perfected the use of platinum on the electrodes, rather than the nickel previously used. Yes, they are the Spark Plug that helped win the Battle of Britain - a platinum moment you might say...
