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
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The ballots have been counted and the membership has spoken.


meetings and sharing the grief of members lost. To most of us this merger should be transparent.

From the Editor





Scott,

I just read Rob Bowen's LED daytime running light (DRL) article in the Feb-Mar Standard and agree with the value of daytime running lights. Wanting to be more visible on the road, I picked up a daytime running light module for my TR6 at a local gas station about 20 years ago. I mounted it on the left side of the footwell, above the clutch area. The ignition and light switch connections are all right there. I switched some dual bullet connectors for



I thought it would be easy to find the same thing again, but the only thing I could find that seems the same is the Cole Hersee Daytime Running Light Module (DRL) No. 48600.

This is not the product I used, but the description is slightly better with a delay at starting: The Cole Hersee DRL module is a fully automatic control that activates two LOW beam headlights in a reduced intensity mode for daytime operation. It is automatically activated, with a ten second delay, by turning the ignition switch to the ON position. The DRL remains active until one or more of the following conditions occur:

- 1. Headlights are turned on manually.
- 2. Parking brake is activated. (Triumph owners would bypass this part per the installation instructions)
- 3. Ignition switch turned to off.

At \$60-80 online, it is more than expected. To see the installation instructions, go to http://www.littelfuse.com and search for 48600. I'd be interested in hearing about this or similar products and I would like to add a DRL module to the GT6.

Flag Racing team to the event with a fleet of race-prepared Spitfires. Joe's

15 year-old son Greg "The Kid" Siam was driving one of the Spitfires and turned out some impressive times over the course of the weekend. One of my personal highlights of the weekend was being able to sit in one of Joe's Spitfires and get a glimpse into the racing experience. Let me tell you, after sitting in that racing Spitfire and experiencing the

sights and sounds of the weekend, I'm hooked on vintage Triumph racing!

Willow Springs in itself is an amazing track to visit. It is the oldest permanent road course in the United States, opening in 1953. If you have



ever seen the 1968 Disney classic film "The Love Bug", you will recognize Willow Springs as being the location of Herbie the Love Bug's first race (as "Jackrabbit Springs" in the film). Entering the main gate, you step back in time into the golden era of amateur racing. There are no pit passes, no fences keeping

the spectators away from the cars, the pit or the paddock. You can go up and look at the cars, talk with the drivers and mechanics, and even go right up to the pit wall as the cars start their engines and make their way onto the track. Just like in the 1950's and 1960's!

The cars themselves were a treat to behold. Not only did our own Paul Smock and Joe Siam have their Triumphs in the event, Paul's racing buddies and friends Mordy Dunst and Frank Daley were there with their TR4s. Paul,

Mordy and Frank are a part of their own "E Ticket" Triumph Team, named after the famed Disneyland rides... the team sure surpasses the excitement of any E Ticket ride! I also met another racer named Dale Wallace with a



1964 Spitfire racer, and there were also two early GT6s entered in the same class. To top it all off, Triumph racing legend Kas Kastner was at the event enjoying the racing. Next time I go to Willow Springs, I'm bringing my Kas Kastner "Triumph Preparation Handbook" for an autograph...Kastner was the father of Triumph USA's competition department as well as having enormous influence on Triumph's own factory racing efforts in the UK.

Some other amazing cars included a whole sedan class composed of BMW 2002s, Datsun 510s, Alfa Romeo GTs and a couple of Austin/Morris Mini Coopers. Other highlights included a Marcos from the UK, a beautiful Jaguar XK120, a Daimler SP250 "Dart", a Lotus 7, a couple of Elvas, a Turner, and an original Ford GT40 that, judging by its license plates and right hand drive, made its way from South Africa!

American muscle was well represented, with a big bore class of Shelby Cobras, vintage Mustangs (both Shelby and standard versions), Camaros and Corvettes. Even open wheelers had an event, with Formula Fords, Coopers, Lotus, Formula Vees and other Formula models in attendance.

On to the main event itself, the morning practice went well for all Triumphs with no issues or accidents. However, by the time the qualifying race started in the afternoon, things began to change. Early in the qualifying, Mordy Dunst lost the brakes on his TR4. Facing with the option of flying off the track at speed or slowing down by bumping another car, he had no

choice but use the brakes on Paul's car! Paul spun out and had to make his way back to the pit for inspection. Paul took some minor damage in the back, suffered a broken left hand taillight lens and missing trunk handle. Mordy on the other hand lost his left hand fender and crumpled his hood. However, both Paul and Mordy

electronic ignitions. Also, be careful when you decide how much compression you want and that today's gas REALLY is worse than we think. No one had life threatening problems and I'm sure we all learned something about our cars.

The WINNER for the day was Steve Petersen and his orange 1980 TR8 at 163hp and 210lbft.
